The University of Asia and the Pacific (UA&P) will conduct a seminar-workshop on Teaching Rizal's Noli Me Tangere and El Filibusterismo for Wisdom and Citizenship in the K to 12 Curriculum with the theme The Life of Jose Rizal During the Writing of Noli Me Tangere and El Filibusterismo from April 26 to 28, 2017 at the Telengtan Hall of the UA&P in Pasig City.

The Seminar-Workshop aims to:

2. demonstrate to them some of the best practices in teaching approaches and

assessment tools used in these subjects; and

3. illustrate to them how the learners can use critical analysis, academic reasoning, and practice responsible citizenship and civic virtues.

The target participants are Grades 6 to 10 teachers of Filipino and Araling Panlipunan from both public and private schools.

The activity will be held on April 26-28, 2017 (Wednesday to Friday) at the Telengtan Hall, University of Asia and the Pacific campus, Pearl Drive, Ortigas Center, Pasig City.

This activity is the second of our three-year series on "Teaching Rizal's *Noli Me Tangere* and *El Filibusterismo* for Wisdom and Citizenship in the K to 12 Curriculum." 1. To develop correct and deeper understanding of the historical background behind Rizal's novels in order for teachers to have strong and integral understanding of historical concepts, themes, and issues in history and historiography:

To demonstrate some of the best practices in teaching approaches and assessment tools used in these subjects; and
 To illustrate how the learners can use critical analysis, academic reasoning, and practice responsible citizenship

and civic virtues.

Highly accomplished members of the UA&P History Department, Dr. Paul A. Dumol, Dr. Clement C. Camposano, Dr. Marya Svetlana T. Camacho, and Dr. Arnel E. Joven will give the lectures for our activity. They will be present to guide and moderate the workshop sessions as well.
