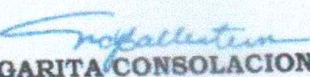

This has reference to the communication from the Institute of APEC Collaborative Education (IACE) Korea regarding the 2022 APEC School Leadership Program (ASLP) to be virtually held from December 5-7, 2022.

The ASLP was initiated by APEC Community for Education Innovation (CEDI), which was officially launched by the APEC Human Resources Development Working Group (HRDWG) in 2017. CEDI aims to (1) excavate the best modalities of teaching and learning in the APEC region and (2) proliferate and promote them within the region. To attain such purposes, CEDI has two major activities: one is a joint research conducted by global research teams, and the other is a pilot program originated from the joint research outcome. Having held two pilot programs with 14 school leaders from 5 APEC economies in 2019, IACE officially launched the program in 2020. At the first round of a school leadership development program, ASLP invited 30 leaders from 6 economies.

This year, IACE will be conducting the ASLP with the theme "School leadership development and networking contributing to fostering future talents in times of multicultural and transformative education environment.", targeting seventy (70) school leaders from nine (9) economies. Out of the seventy (70) school leaders, six (6) will be coming from the Philippines.

In this regard, we would humbly request you to **nominate two (2) Principals or Assistant Principals of elementary schools** in your region to participate in the abovementioned program. We would appreciate receiving your nomination **on or before November 24, 2022.**

## 2022 APEC School Leadership Program (ASLP)

Institute of APEC Collaborative Education (IACE)

### 1. Context

APEC School Leadership Program (ASLP) was initiated by APEC Community for Education Innovation (CEDI), officially launched by the APEC Human Resources Development Working Group (HRDWG) in 2017.

The purposes of CEDI are as follows: 1) to excavate best modalities of teaching and learning in the APEC region and 2) to proliferate and promote them within the region. To attain such purposes, CEDI consists of two major activities: one is a joint research conducted by global research teams, and the other is a pilot program originated from the joint research outcome.

Through research conducted in 2018-2019, a conclusion was drawn that teachers' competencies are crucial to nurture future talents who can effectively respond to the fast-changing society. Another key finding is that school leaders' competencies have a positive correlation with professional development of working-level teachers.

According to an estimate by the UNESCO, over 89% of the total population of students enrolled in education globally are affected and are out of school due to the COVID-19. OECD suggests that effective school leadership is essential to improve the efficiency, equity and quality of education (Pont et al., 2008). It also demonstrates that successful school leaders can improve teaching and learning indirectly and most powerfully through their support and influence on staff motivation, commitment and working conditions (Leithwood et al., 2008).

Having held two pilot programs with 14 school leaders from 5 APEC economies in 2019, the Institute of APEC Collaborative Education (IACE) officialized the program last year, 2020. At the first round of a school leadership development program, ASLP invited 30 leaders from 6 economies.

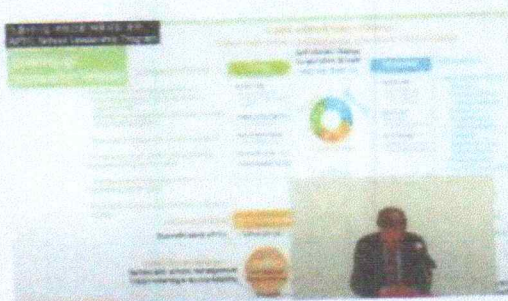
