## Generative AI: The End of Language Teaching?



**Fr. Johnny Go** is the Founding Dean of the Cokongwei Brothers School of Education and Learning Design at Ateneo de Manila University. He serves as Basic Education Coordinator for the Jesuit Asia Pacific Conference, conducting teacher training across the region. He teaches Education, Philosophy at Ateneo de Manila, and Science, Technology, Society at University of the Philippines. He holds EDDs from UCL Institute of Education and Singapore NIE.

Formerly Director of Ateneo SALT Institute, Fr. Johnny led Xavier School San Juan and Nuvali as President (2001-2013), introducing innovative programs like Xavier China Experience, Apple One-to-One Learning, and International Baccalaureate Diploma. Fr. Go's "Pins of Light" offers online retreats and Bible blogs. He is recognized for his educational leadership and contributions to teaching methodologies.

## ELT and an AI world: Language teaching and learning in a sci-fi age



The rise of AI has signaled the end of the world as we know it. With AI, the game of language teaching and learning has entered the sci-fi age, involving machines and apps taking over our classrooms. Now, we are forced to engage with issues of what to teach and how to teach when the human-machine (or app) interface is frighteningly real. What this means for language learning and development, as well as our human meaning-making processes, has to be explored. Even more profoundly, we need to ask what human languaging means, as opposed to machine languaging. This talk explores these and related issues impacting ELT in an AI age. Jumping off from data of AI use in writing in English, I hope to offer teachers some idea of how to navigate this brave new world, while, at the same time, still teach language and retain our sense of joy.

**Dr. Priscilla Angela T. Cruz** is an Associate Professor at the Department of English, Ateneo de Manila University, in Manila, the Philippines. As a teacher, she works with undergraduate students on writing and literature courses. With graduate students, she focuses on working with them on discourse analysis, applicable linguistics, and research in their own teaching contexts. As a researcher, she has published on Systemic Functional Linguistics, educational linguistics, language variation, World Englishes, mother tongue education, plurilingualism, and interdisciplinary approaches which involve linguistics and other fields such as health and business. Recently, she has started work on Systemic Functional Linguistics and the local languages of the Philippines.

## Language and Literacy for a World in Transition



This talk will focus on various theories and principles relevant to the use of technology in language acquisition skills and literacy development at the basic education level. It will discuss children's emerging abilities - how they use language and how language ability affects learning and development especially emerging literacy. The speaker draws insights from experiences culled from his own interaction with students and his professional discussions with other teachers.

**Mr. Frederick Sotto Perez** is the Assistant Principal for Academics at Xavier School, Nuvali. He obtained his Bachelor of Art in Journalism degree from the University of Santo Tomas. In 2000, he took a diploma in French Studies and Literature from the University of Aix-Marseille III and the University of Provence. He finished his Master's degree in Reading Education from the University of the Philippines- Diliman in 2012 with a Master's thesis focusing on adolescent literacy.

As a classroom teacher, he promotes reading and writing strategies using evidence-based frameworks and total participation techniques (TPT). He is a staunch supporter of research-based practices in teaching reading and writing and family literacy with the Reading Association of the Philippines (RAP) where he served as president from 2019-2022. During the pandemic, he has shared his expertise in many webinars and virtual conferences in his different fields of interests.

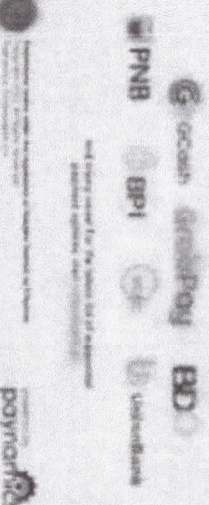

## Workshop A

### TECHniques in TEACHING Grammar and Writing: Create, Elevate, and Innovate

Dr. Maria Luz Elena N. Canilao, Ateneo de Manila University

Mr. Alfonz Vincent C. Chopitea, Xavier School San Juan

How do you enrich the teaching of grammar and writing with the gifts of today's technology? How do you establish a classroom atmosphere that makes use of tools to strengthen the grammar and writing skills of multilingual learners? How do you design grammar and writing tasks that inspire learners to become eloquent communicators? This workshop answers these questions and enables participants to create meaningful lessons, elevate their teaching strategies, and innovate their pedagogical methods.

By reflecting on their past and present language learning and teaching experiences, participants examine the burdens and blessings of using technology as a tool for teaching grammar and writing. They are guided in choosing and using technology effectively and appropriately in their particular teaching contexts. Through this workshop, they learn about various TECHniques in TEACHING grammar and writing and they are given opportunities to develop their own tactics to empower their students in the digital era.

**Maria Luz Elena N. Canilao** is Associate Professor at the Ateneo de Manila University. She has served as Associate Chair for Language Programs at the Ateneo de Manila University Loyola Schools and as Chair of the English Department at the Ateneo de Manila High School. Her works focus on multilingual education; translanguaging; language planning and policy; and Global Englishes. She is an ACET Trainer and consultant. She has worked with various institutions including the Department of Education, the Commission on Higher Education, and the British Council, Philippines. Her primary advocacy is the empowerment of learners and teachers in multilingual contexts.

**Alfonz Vincent C. Chopitea** currently teaches English Language and Literature and Theory of Knowledge to students under the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme at Xavier School San Juan. He has helped in training teachers for the K-12 Curriculum for Grades 9-12 in partnership with the Department of Education. He has also given talks on the teaching of oral communication skills, reading techniques, and writing. At present, he is finishing his master's degree in English Language and Literature Teaching at the Ateneo de Manila University.

## Workshop B

### Reading Smarter: Using Signposts and Tech Tools for Better Engagement and Reading Comprehension

Ms. Michelle Paterno, Ateneo de Manila University

Mr. Paolo Suapengco, Xavier School

In the 21st century, reading well remains a critical skill for students. In the past, developing close reading skills emphasized the need to make connections within the text without necessarily making explicit how to make those connections in the first place.

Moreover, the use of technology is no longer considered revolutionary in the current educational landscape. However, it is important for educators to reflect on why it is vital and discover ways to use it to enhance instruction.

In this workshop, we review what it means to develop students' close reading skills by focusing on signposts writers use to signal significant moments in both literary and non-literary texts. By helping students notice "trigger points" in texts, we help them build the necessary metacognitive processes that make comprehension processes more transparent. In addition, there will be opportunities to learn easy-to-use tech tools meant to enhance student learning through engagement and collaboration.

**Michelle Paterno** has been teaching for over two decades at the Ateneo de Manila University where she handles both graduate and undergraduate classes. At present, she is also completing her Ph.D. studies at the University of the Philippines' College of Education as a reading major.

**Paolo Suapengco** began his education career as a high school English teacher in Xavier School in 2011. He has held the positions of English Department Chairperson and International Baccalaureate Diploma Program Coordinator while teaching English Language and Literature and Theory of Knowledge. He earned his master's degree in Basic Education Teaching from the Ateneo de Manila University in 2019. Currently, he is the Assistant Principal for Academics for Junior High School.

## Workshop C

### Developing Viewing Skills to Enrich Oral Communication

Irene Barcebal Benitez, Ateneo de Manila University

Cynthia Eliza S. Punzalan, Xavier School

We are living in a visual and multimodal world where images and texts make up the majority of what we see. With the power of the internet and the continuous development of digital technology, the creation and sharing of visual content has never been easier. As a result, multimodality has become a vital part of how we communicate which greatly affects how communicative competence is developed. This course will allow us to understand what viewing is and why it is important in the language classroom. How is the skill of viewing developed and how can it be used to enhance the students' oral communication skills? What are the different frameworks or strategies that may be used in the classroom? At the end of the workshop, teachers are expected to have developed the skill and confidence in designing lessons to develop students' viewing skills

**Irene Barcebal Benitez** is an instructor at the English Department of the Ateneo de Manila University, teaching purposive communication and literary analysis undergraduate students and language/literature teaching and measurement/assessment to graduate students. She is also the director of the Ateneo Language Learning Center which focuses on teaching EFL for basic to intermediate foreign students, Academic English to the more advanced ones and Business English to professionals. She earned her M.A. in English Language and Literature Teaching degree from the Ateneo de Manila University.

**Cynthia Eliza S. Punzalan** is an experienced High School English teacher at Xavier School San Juan, with a Bachelor of Secondary Education Major in English degree from the University of Santo Tomas. Currently, she leads the teachers of the Grade 8 English team of Xavier School in fostering a cohesive learning environment that encourages academic excellence and personal growth.

## Workshop D

### Technology-based Assessment of/for English Language Learning

Dr. Isabel Pefianco Martin, Ateneo de Manila University

Mr. Christian Bumatayo, Xavier School

This workshop on technology-based assessment of English language learning (ELL) draws from the principles of reflexive pedagogy that uphold learning as ubiquitous and collaborative. In addition, reflexive pedagogy asserts that learners, being active knowledge producers, must be exposed to multimodal knowledge representations and recursive feedback. Thus, curriculum, teaching, and assessment must be differentiated. As this workshop is concerned with assessment of learning, participants will have opportunities to design formative and summative assessment tasks that make use of current educational technologies, and more importantly, anchored on the principles of reflexive pedagogy. At the end of this workshop, the participants should be able to (1) describe assessment practices that are anchored on the principles of reflexive pedagogy; (2) identify technological tools that may be used to gather evidence of learning; (3) design formative and summative assessment tasks that make use of currently available technological tools; and (4) recognize the valuable contributions of technology in assessment of learning.

**Isabel Pefianco Martin** is Professor and Chair of the Department of Educational Leadership and Management at the Ateneo de Manila University, Philippines. She is also Coordinator for Research at the Gokongwei Brothers School of Education and Learning Design in the same university. Professor Martin is a leading figure in English language studies in the country, having published in various internationally recognized publications on topics ranging from world Englishes, Philippine English, English language education, English sociolinguistics, and forensic/legal linguistics. Professor Martin is currently the President of the International Association for World Englishes (IAWE) and Managing Editor of *Asian Englishes*, a Scopus-indexed journal.

**Christian Bumatayo** is a dedicated educator who has contributed more than twenty years to the field of education. His time at Xavier School has showcased his versatility and unwavering commitment. As the chairperson of the high school English department, Christian excelled in language instruction and curriculum development. In his role as the assistant to the principal for academics at Father Pierre Triz Institute - ERDA Tech, he actively worked to bridge educational disparities and ensure underprivileged students received a quality education. Over the past three years, Christian has also served as the High School Technology Integration Coordinator, utilizing his experience to enhance the integration of technology into the curriculum. Currently, Christian also holds the position of Senior High School Assistant Coordinator and an IB Language and Literature instructor. His extensive experience has provided him with a deep understanding of the importance of adaptability and innovation in overcoming adversity. Christian firmly believes in the transformative power of education and its potential to positively shape lives.
