On April 27-May 2, 2024, Saceda Youth Lead School will embark on a leadership journey in Japan. A group of student leaders and teachers from across the Philippines will be attending this annual event in Tokyo.

The Saceda Youth Lead International Program in Japan aims to appreciate and understand the geo-political issues in the Asia Pacific regions by personally witnessing, discussing and exploring local poverty, education, socio-economic, cultural and political issues. This is a bigger effort to train them to be acutely aware of regional and global affairs and grasp the ramifications and impact on the Philippines and its future.

Purposes:

1. To expose participants to other peoples' culture through leadership and social action;
2. To study common patterns that emerge across all cultures and how these patterns reveal the diversity of human experience and environmental well-being in our education, leadership and disaster preparedness and management.
3. To identify similarities in cultural behaviors, norms etc; and to experience the culture of people through visits and panel discussions;
4. To meet local leaders,
5. To provide enrichment in the education through institutional visits, conferences, instruction and school visits,
6. To train and empower participants to become future leaders of the country and,
7. To promote peace and mutual understanding through travel and exchange.

The registration fees is Fifty Five Thousand Pesos (Php55,000) to cover the one time visa fee, tuition fee of the SIPA Japan 2024 with full day programs with interactions and visitations , 4,000 Yen JR Train Pass within Tokyo, daily breakfast, hostel accommodation, Mt. I understand that the following are prohibited: the use of alcohol, tobacco or illegal drugs, discriminatory comments, violence and sexual misconduct. I understand that I, being a participant, am responsible for my conduct at all times and I must comply with the health and safety regulations, environmental protection, policies and behavior set forth by SYL and the host city. I understand that any violation of the above will be ground for expulsion without refund of the registration fee I paid. I further understand that the leadership exchange activities are exciting, character building and fun, however, I also understand that it will be strenuous, physically and emotionally challenging. I will cooperate with other members and the staff without complaints and murmur, and I will do my best to maintain a positive attitude. I agree to abide with the above and I am enthusiastic in participating in the program.

In consideration of the right to attend and participate, the participant hereby:

1. That my participation to the program is final and voluntary.
2. To pay the registration fees of Fifty Five Thousand Pesos Php55,000 to cover the training tuition fees (lectures, venues, kits and materials), One Time Visa Fee, triple share hotel tatami accommodation, daily continental breakfast and select meals and land arrangements and airport transfers.
3. Roundtrip airfare is on personal account.
4. That I will pay the sign-up fee of Ten Thousand Pesos (Non Refundable Fee due on December 15, 2023. This is non-refundable.
5. That I will secure my Travel Authority.
6. Authorize SYL or any of its agents to provide, obtain, or authorize any reasonable incidental and emergency medical treatment for the participants in the event of illness, injury or incapacity and hereby accepts all responsibilities.
7. Acknowledges that there is an element of risk involve in any activity like travel outside owns home and community; certifies that, I, the participant, is physically, mentally and emotionally capable of attending and participating in the activities; assumes all risks of financial responsibility for any loss or injury that may occur as a result of misconduct and indemnifies and holds SYL harmless.
